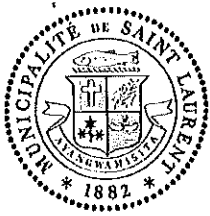

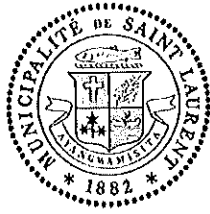

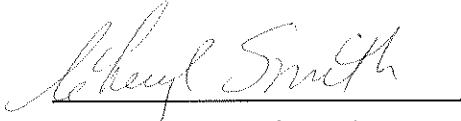

Councillor Tom Johnson's Report:

- Planning District meeting was cancelled to make way for the Province's pre-budget meeting held here at the Rec Centre on October 17. Many good ideas and good questions were presented at this particular community exercise.
- RM's Special Meeting on October 6, 2017 resulted in the hire of RDW Recycling, a company from Rosser, to take care of the bin placement and hauling of household waste at the Waste Transfer Site.
- Had quick meeting with Minister of Municipal Relations today October 18.
- Oak Point – Old Time Dance well attended – over 100 people. Going to be doing a few renovations to the Hall to help winterize it a bit.

Councillor Monte Carrier's Report:

- Community Futures in Ashern on October 11. Will be re-establishing work done on the Regional Development strategies and that will resume on November 20th.
- Grahamdale is asking for a letter of support – when the channel goes in, that RM will be losing quite a bit of tax-base and will have the potential for population reduction and so they will be facing a decrease in tax dollars which they can't afford. Basket funding given by the Province does not seem to look at the different circumstances of each RM's needs. They will resend letter for our response.

Councillor Frank Bruce's Report:

- Attended meetings with Public Works and Ministers – reported by Tom above.
- Will be getting a test patch done with the rubber aggregate to see how it holds up.

- Went to look at the trailhead signs. They look good.
- Waste Transfer Site – wood, shrubbery pile – will be safer to get rid of when snow on the ground.

Councillor Laurent Kerbrat's Report:

- Attended meetings regarding fine options.

Reeve Cheryl Smith's Report:

- In attendance at Ministers' Meetings on the 17th and 18 of October.
 - Very good points, concerns and recommendations made at the presentation yesterday (the 17th). We will start looking at doing things differently with regards to approaching the government for projects and funding – proposals in partnership – what we think we can do to help, and cost-saving proposals resulting in a win-win for all. We will be looking forward to some good discussions with the Province going forward.
- We will be getting staff to design and draft a proposal to the Province to have unique signage installed along key areas of Provincial Roads.
- Meeting with Canada 150 Committee – for reconciliation of book-keeping. Ledgers to be balance and cheques will be issued soon. Looks like around \$2500 to each non-profit organization. They have also agreed to give \$500 to Seniors Resource for their volunteer contribution.
